**RESOLUTION OF
THE VILLAGE OF MARTIN'S ADDITIONS**

**SUBJECT: RESOLUTION TO ADOPT A POLICY REGARDING THE
INSTALLATION AND PLACEMENT OF OBJECTS IN THE
PUBLIC RIGHTS-OF-WAY**

WHEREAS, Section 501 of the Charter of the Village of Martin's Additions authorizes the Village Council to pass such regulations as it may deem necessary for the preservation of the property, rights, and privileges of the Village and its residents;

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Martin's Additions finds that structures, plantings, and other objects installed or placed in the public rights-of-way must be regulated to protect the public safety and welfare, and to prevent the creation of obstructions, safety hazards, and public nuisances;

WHEREAS, the Policy attached hereto was introduced by the Council at its open meeting on April 15, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that adopting the Policy attached hereto is necessary for the preservation of the property, rights, and privileges of the Village and its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is, this 17th day of June, 2010, by the Village Council:

RESOLVED, that the Policy attached hereto (Policy No. 4-10-2) be and is hereby adopted, and it is further;

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall become effective on July 8, 2010, and it is further;

RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution shall be permanently filed by the Secretary and kept available for public inspection.

Policy on the Installation and Placement of Objects in the Public Rights-of-Way

The Village of Martin's Additions maintains the public rights-of-way within its boundaries. The Village Council finds that structures, plantings, and other objects installed or placed in the public rights-of-way must be regulated to protect the public safety and welfare, and to prevent the creation of obstructions, safety hazards, and public nuisances.

For this reason, it is the policy of the Village to prohibit the placement of any structure or object, including but not limited to, play equipment, permanent or portable basketball, hockey, soccer, and lacrosse goals, in the public rights-of-way until a license to use the public right-of-way has been executed in a form approved by the Village.
