**RESOLUTION OF
THE VILLAGE OF MARTIN'S ADDITIONS**

SUBJECT: RESOLUTION TO ADOPT POLICY REGARDING SUMP-
PUMP DISCHARGES IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY

WHEREAS, Section 501 of the Charter of the Village of Martin's Additions authorizes the Village Council to pass such regulations as it may deem necessary for the preservation of the property, rights, and privileges of the Village and its residents;

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Martin's Additions finds that that sump-pump discharges into public rights-of-way must be regulated to protect public safety and prevent the creation of public nuisances, including but not limited to erosion, standing water, and icing problems;

WHEREAS, the Policy attached hereto was introduced by the Council at its open meeting on April 15, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that adopting the Policy attached hereto is necessary for the preservation of the property, rights, and privileges of the Village and its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is, this 17th day of June, 2010, by the Village Council:

RESOLVED, that the Policy attached hereto (Policy No. 4-10-1) be and is hereby adopted, and it is further;

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall become effective on July 8, 2010, and it is further;

RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution shall be permanently filed by the Secretary and kept available for public inspection.

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Policy No. 4-10-1

Policy on Sump-Pump Discharges in the Public Rights-of-Way

Pursuant to Section 6-302 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Martin's Additions, a permit is required for the placement of any structure or object in a public right-of-way. Pursuant to Section 6-302 and 7-209, no permit shall be issued until a license to use the right-of-way has been executed in a form approved by the Village.

The Village Council finds that sump-pump discharges into public rights-of-way must be regulated to protect public safety and prevent the creation of public nuisances, including but not limited to erosion, standing water, and icing problems. For this reason, it is the policy of the Village of Martin's Addition to generally prohibit sump-pump discharges onto a street. Absent extraordinary circumstances, the Village of Martin's Additions will not grant a license to use the right-of-way to discharge a sump-pump onto a street.
